PURPOSE

The purpose of Anointed Word Christian Schools International is to meet the total needs of its children. The physical, social, emotional, academic, and spiritual needs encompass the complete child. We at AWCSI set our focus on providing quality education that will enhance and enrich the lives of each child as well as provide spiritual guidance for the soul. Prayer is a vital part of our day at the School, for we believe without God we can do nothing. We are a Christian School and we do recognize Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

Our main goal is to see that the children are given the very best in education. We set high standards for our children because God sets high standards for us.

OBJECTIVES

1. To provide the highest quality in academic excellence and achievement in a Christian environment.
2. To meet the total physical, spiritual, social, academic, and emotional needs of the child.

3. To train young people for Christian leadership and to instill godly values and high moral character.

INTRODUCTION

Anointed Word Christian School International and Miracle Early Learning Center offer a quality Christian education in a warm, friendly atmosphere. The purpose of this school is to give Christian training along with a solid academic foundation in the basic fundamentals of learning for the average and above-average child. Academic and spiritual standards are high with added emphasis on patriotism and character training. Each student has close, personal contact with well-qualified teachers who are prepared to give each student a thorough scholastic background. AWCSI and MELC have provided excellent academics in a caring Christian environment since 1994.

FACT SHEET

Anointed Word Christian School International offers a ten (10) month educational facility for children Kindergarten through Twelfth grade, with a three (3) month summer enrichment program for children five (5) years to twelve years of age.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

Corporal punishment will not be a disciplinary action at Anointed Word Christian Schools International.

It is the policy of AWCSI to employ verbal correction initially. If further action is necessary, an opportunity for parental involvement is requested.

Please know that the basis for our ministry is to build Godly leaders for the Kingdom of God.

We realize that during the course of the year, incidences will occur that will warrant serious disciplinary actions.

Part of our disciplinary measures will include restrictions from various functions and other school detention. Continued misbehavior can result in suspension and the parents immediately being called to the school, with no restitution on tuition payment. Parents will be notified when disciplinary actions are taken. At no time will fighting be tolerated.

Administration will determine length of suspension for any student involved in a fight-whether that student instigated or actually participated in the fight. Average suspension time will be three (3) to five (5) days, but can vary based on incident.

General Information

Violence at school or school sponsored events will not be tolerated. In addition, weapons are prohibited at school and at school sponsored events. The possession of a dangerous weapon will be considered grounds for expulsion. Groups of students who attack another student will be subject to severe discipline, which may include expulsion.

Students are not to gather around a fight because this impedes assistance being provided for the students who are involved in the fight, increases the possibility of student injuries, show support of inappropriate behavior and provides the opportunity for others to be drawn into the fight. Students who gather around a fight are subject to disciplinary action and are guilty of bystander battery.

Bullying/Teasing

NO TOLERANCE. Any child found bullying and or teasing will be suspended. After three suspensions for these offences, the child will be expelled. All disciplinary actions will be documented and become a part of the child's cumulative record.

Weapons Law

It is unlawful for any person to carry, possess or have under control any weapon at a school building, school function or on school property or on a bus or other transportation furnished by the school.

The term "weapon" means and includes any pistol, revolver, or any weapon designed or intended to propel a missile of any kind, or any knife, bowie knife, switch-blade, ballistic knife, and other knife having a blade of three or more inches, straight-edge razor, spring stick, metal knuckles, blackjacks, or any flailing instrument consisting of two or more rigid parts connected in such a way to allow them to swing freely, which may be known as a nun chuck, or fighting chain, throwing star or oriental dart, or any weapon of like kind.

Punishment: A fine of no more than \$5,000, imprisonment for not more than five years [O.C.G.A. 16-11-127.1]

Administrator along with the Pastor reserves the right to expel permanently any child who endangers or continues to interrupt the educational program of this center.

Please note that parents will be held responsible for any damages to property caused by their child. This does not include normal usage and breakage, but does include any vandalism and/or damages caused by disobedience or breaking of school rules.

In House Suspension of Saturday Detention

Students may receive in-house suspension or Saturday detention as a consequence for inappropriate behavior, inappropriate uniform, no homework, lack of proper supplies and materials in class. These students are to report immediately to In-house Suspension room upon their arrival at school. Students will receive full credit for all assignments completed when assigned to L.H.S.

Saturday detention will be left to the discretion of the school's administration.

Homebound Program

The Anointed Word Christian Schools International Homebound Program is designed as a disciplinary measure.

Any child suspended by a recommendation of the administrator or Pastor will be placed in the homebound program for a designated period of time. During the time in the Homebound Program, assignments and test are still due. If there is a suspension, then that child will come into the school at an appointed time to pickup any assignments and/or take the tests.

There is no restitution made on tuition payments during the time a child is in the Homebound Program.

Makeup Work

Arrangements for makeup work must be made within three (3) days after returning to school.

It will be the practice of the Anointed Word Christian Schools International that students absent due to short- term suspension should read the policy on the Homebound Program.

Suspension

The Anointed Word Christian Schools International provides an in-school suspension program which is issued as a consequence for most rule infractions. On some occasions, when deemed necessary, students may receive out of school suspension. The following behaviors will result in suspension from school: Fighting, Possessing a dangerous weapon, showing disrespect toward faculty or staff, possession of, use of, under the influence of alcohol, possession of, under the influence of drugs, vandalism.

Possession of a dangerous weapon may also be used as grounds for expulsion compliance with the school policy. In addition, any behaviors, which are disruptive to the educational process, may result in suspension.

Students who are suspended from school are not permitted to attend school functions, practices, or activities. Students can make up work issues while on an out-of-school suspension, but it is the responsibility of the student.

Dress Code

There is a positive relationship between a neat, appropriate appearance and a good learning environment. All students are encouraged to take pride in themselves and in their school work.

To create the most optional uniform dress code is in effect. Please check with administration for details.

Only the uniform designed by the school will be permitted. No substations or similar clothing will be permitted. Children will not be permitted to class without appropriate uniform.

Hair Cuts and Earrings

Boys' hair cuts must be kept neat and moderate. No tail, braids, afros (no higher than 2 inches), carvings (in head and/ or eyebrows), Mohawks, mod styles, braids, dreadlocks, and hair dyes will not be permitted. No tattoos. Boys must wear belts at all times and absolutely no jogging pants. Earrings are not permitted for boys **AT ALL(ears, eyebrows, nose, lips, cheeks, jaws, etc.)**

Girls should not wear dangling long earrings; they should wear small loops, studs, or pearls. The School is not responsible for any lost earrings. Girls hair dye should be neutral (no blue, purple, orange, yellow, green, pink, gray, white, silver, and/or bright red). No tattoos and piercings in the eyebrows, nose, lips, cheeks, jaws, etc.

Please note that when in doubt of any of the rules and regulations, then please contact the front office.

Please be advised that we the support staff, teachers, and/or administration has the right to dismiss or expel your student if they are found in possession of artifacts, drawings on their skin and/or paper, and/ or other gang related apparel.

Personal Belongings

Parents are requested to see that children **NOT** bring toys and electronics of any types (unless requested) to the School. The School will not be responsible for these toys. This also includes **GUM and Money**. The materials and play areas at the School are structured and shared by the children as part of their learning experiences.

Money and Valuables

Students should not bring large sums of money or valuables to school. School is not responsible for any lost or stolen money or valuables.

Attendance Policy

Because class attendance is vitally important to proper **learning**, we encourage consistent, daily attendance. Every effort should be made to arrange **for** trips and appointments so that the least possible amount of school is missed.

Whenever students arrive late to school or leave early from school, a signed note from the parents or guardians must be brought to the administrator. A child with six (6) unexcused tardies in a quarter will equal one (1) absent. In the case of severe illness AWCSI will place a child in the Helping Overcome Encounters (HOPE) program, so that his education process will not be interrupted. Devotion is a vital part of the school day and all children are expected to be present.

Students are warned that absences and tardies will have negative scholastic consequences; good attendance is a necessity when seeking a quality Christian Education. Students should be absent only when it is necessary. If a student has an excused absence, he/she is allowed to complete missed work for credit within three (3) days of the absence. It is the responsibility of the student to meet with the teacher and make arrangements for the make-up work.

1. Parents/Guardians must call the attendance office on the day of the absence by 8:00 a.m.
2. A note from a parent/guardian must be brought to school on the day following the above. Bring the note to the homeroom teacher to receive an absentee note which will admit the child to class.
3. The school will check absentees by calling parents at home or work. Students found to be truant will receive disciplinary action.

Tardy

A student is tardy if not inside the classroom and seated at 8:15am. Excessive tardies will result in disciplinary action.

Truancy

Students absent from school without the consent/knowledge of their parents or guardians are truant. The absence will be considered unexcused and the student will be subject to disciplinary action.

Any peace officer may assume temporary custody, during school hours, of any child subject to compulsory school attendance who is found away from home and who is absent from public or private school or a home study program without a valid written excuse from school officials or from parent or guardian in charge of the home study program. (GA.L. 1976, p 768, 1; GA.L. 1984, p 1266,5)

Tuition

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE TUITION POLICIES COVER A COMPLETE SCHOOL-TERM. IF FOR ANY REASON YOUR CHILD(REN) DOES NOT COMPLETE THE

FULL SCHOOL-TERM. THE PARENT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL TUITION PAYMENTS FROM AUGUST-MAY. ALSO, IF THIS MONEY IS NOT PAID. THE PARENT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY COURT COST INCURRED. (PLEASE REFER TO THE FINANCIAL TUITION.

*THE TUITION POLICY IS FOR BOTH GENERAL EDUCATIONAL AND SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS.

Please be advised if you (the parent or guardian) do not uphold your financial obligation, Anointed Word Christian School International and Miracle Early Learning Center has the right not to release transcripts, report cards, test results/ scores, as well as not readmit your child/ student into the class until the balance is clear/ settled. In other words, we reserve the right to put your child out of school and you risk being reported to truancy. All legal fees that will be accrued will be at your experience.

Withdrawal Procedures

All students must be withdrawn from school by the parent or legal guardian. The parents must fill out all withdrawal papers the day prior to the last day of attendance. This request form withdrawal is to be given to the school's office before classes begin that morning so that necessary papers may be completed.

Telephone Regulations

Students are not allowed to use telephone except in emergencies. Cell phones are not to be used during school hours. If a cell phone is used during school hours, the office will retrieve that phone until the end of the school year.

Students must be ready and equipped daily for class with appropriate supplies and materials.

Children can purchase needed supplies (papers, pencils, pens, tablets, etc.) from the school's store between 7:30 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.

Children entering class without proper supplies will be sent to the office to call parents in order to verify charges made from the school store in order to re-enter class or child will remain in suspension room until needed supplies are brought to the school. **Under no circumstance will the child be allowed to remain in class without proper supplies.**

Office

Students are not to enter the office without a pass. Students coming to the rest-room must also have a Hall Pass. The school cannot provide change to students.

Passes

Students not in their assigned places are required to have a pass.

Parking

Parents and visitors are expected to observe the traffic regulations. **The speed limit is 10 miles per hour.**

1. Anointed Word Christian Schools International, Inc. assumes no responsibility for any damage or loss to vehicles driven or parked on campus.
2. All persons (occupants of motor vehicles as well as operator) shall comply with any direction(s) given by school authorized personnel.
3. No person shall drive a vehicle at a speed that will endanger the safety of others on campus. **Maximum speed limit in the parking lot is 10 MPH.**
4. The parking on any vehicle so that it obstructs the normal flow of traffic or blocks designated parking areas is prohibited.
5. No students will be allowed to go to any vehicle during the school day unless they are leaving the campus or have written permission from the principal.
6. Students will comply with all School policies and guidelines.
7. All drop-offs and pick-ups will occur in the designated area.

Late Work Policy

Homework and some other assignments may be accepted for three (3) days after the due date.

These guidelines do not apply to absent students. They are for students who are present when the assignment is given.

This will be done only twice per semester for any student.

Habitual offenders lose the right to late submission.

Some types of work that cannot be accepted late are listed below.

- a. Labs
- b. Assignments to be completed in class

- c. Work which should have been completed before a unit change such as in art when ceramics ends and weaving begins
- d. Others unique to certain subject areas

Grade reductions

- a. 1 day late = 10% reduction
- b. 2 days late = 25% reduction
- c. 3 days late = 45% reduction
- d. 4 days late = not accepted

However, please understand that this policy is subjected to change and it depends on the discretion teacher policy (especially for High School and Middle School).

Laws

Students are required to obey the same laws on campus as off. Any student violating a criminal or civil law at school will be subject to suspension and/or prosecution.

Lost and Found Articles

Students should turn in lost articles to either the teacher or the office. Students may claim articles in the office.

Selling

Students may not sell any item at school without permission from the administrator.

Respect for Facility and Equipment

We are fortunate in that we have the privilege of attending school in a modern, attractive, and air conditioned building. Students should take pride in their school and make every possible effort to keep the building as clean as possible. Each student is expected to assume responsibility for the care of all school property. Students who damage property accidentally are responsible for paying the damage. Pupils who willfully deface or damage school property in any way shall pay in full for all damages and may be suspended from school.

Emergency Drills

Emergency drills at regular intervals are required by law and are important safety precautions. It is essential that when the signal is given, each person promptly follow the appropriate procedures. Students are not to talk during the drills.

Chapel

Prayer and missions are vital parts of our total school's program. Children will attend weekly chapel sessions and are asked to contribute weekly to our missions offerings.

Report Cards/Mid Progress Reports

Report cards are issued at the end of the each nine (9) week period. Interim progress reports are also issued at the fourth week in order to give students and parents an estimate of progress. If parents have outstanding balances, report cards will not be administered to students until all fees are cleared.

Visitors

Visitors are not allowed at school. Students should encourage their friends not to visit them at school. All persons having business at school must register in the office as to the nature of their business.

This policy also applies to parents and guardians desiring to observe their child's classroom. All conferences with teachers and or administration must be scheduled through the school's office. Drop in conferences will not be permitted.

Parents are more than welcome to visit and sit in their child's classroom but must call the school at least an hour before arriving. Parents/guardians who refuse to abide by this policy will be asked to withdraw their child from the school.

Protest

Students who participate in walkouts are considered withdrawn from school. Before any student can be reinstated, a conference must be held with the student, the principal, and the parent or guardian. Reinstatement is at the discretion of the principal.

Student Advisory Team

The Student Advisory Team is comprised of students from each grade who serve during their high school career as members of SAT. Students are encouraged to provide information and input about their concerns to members of this group who meet regularly with the principal.

Special Needs Students and Scholarships

AWCSI welcomes the GA Special Need Scholarships along with its recipient. However, all students that are being served through this scholarship must adhere to all policies and

procedures, codes of conducts, academic requirements, financial agreements, and parental support established by AWCSI.

Special modifications will be made on an individual student basis to better assist students in their academic endeavors. Parents will be informed regularly about their child's progress. AWCSI does not guarantee that all students will progress at a fast pace. However, with time and dedication, we believe that all students have the ability to learn and succeed.

Health

All students must comply with the law and public regulations in regards to immunization (Form 3032). Consult your family doctor concerning your child's requirements.

If prescription drugs or over-the-counter remedies are required during the school day, the parent will be required to send a signed note to the school indicating the dosage and frequency of medication. Medicine will be administered: 12:00 noon and 4:00 p.m. only. Only upon receipt of a signed medical form of which you can obtain from the office. All medication must be in the original container and the child's name clearly labeled. Parents must reclaim the medication when picking up the child.

Communicable Disease:

The School is a place for **WELL** children, if your child is: Running a Temperature, Vomiting, Appears ill, or has signs of a communicable disease, please leave him/her at home.

In the event your child is absent from school due to a communicable disease, you may be required to provide a medical statement verifying that your child is free of the communicable disease before he/she re-enters the School.

While it is not the desire of Anointed Word Christian Schools International to discriminate against any student, we are faced with the challenge of providing a safe haven for those entrusted to our care by their loving parents. Our purpose is to protect our students from exposure to mortal illness.

We recognize also that AWCSI with its limited finances is not equipped to physically care for the needs of very ill students or any student with a serious continuing or chronic communicable disease.

Children enrolled at AWCSI or who seek to enroll at AWCSI, who are diagnosed to be carrying any serious and continuing communicable or potentially lethal disease, shall be denied admission or dismissed from the School. They will not be permitted to enroll or

re-enroll in regular AWCSI classes until they have been medically diagnosed as no longer carrying the communicable disease.

This policy is to apply to disease such as, but not limited to, syphilis, gonorrhea, Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS), ETC. Students who test positive for antibodies of HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) or who are infected with ARC (AIDS Related Complex) are included in the policy.

It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian of a student to inform the School of the student's infection by any serious and continuing communicable disease upon enrollment (of a new student) or at the time of diagnosis (for a current student)

In adopting this policy, AWCSI recognizes that the state of medical knowledge about AIDS and other serious communicable diseases is rapidly changing. The School will, therefore, update the policy statement in light of significant new information on such diseases.

Helping Overcome Physical Encounter Program**

“H.O.P.E.”

H.O.P.E. is a program designed for students currently enrolled in AWCSI and during the course of the school year. If the child has encountered severe medical complications which would prohibit him/her from attending school on a daily basis a teacher will visit the child in the home approximately 2 to 3 days per week, depending on the need as determined by the administration. In order for a child to qualify for the H.O.P.E. program, he/she must be disabled for at least two weeks or more.

Details will be worked out on an individual basis. Tuition payments remain the same for any child on the H.O.P.E. program.

H.O.P.E. is designed so that the educational process of a child will not be interrupted.

Anointed Word Christian Schools International High Achievers Program “H.A.P.”

The gifted program at Anointed Word Christian Schools International is designed to further challenge students toward excellence. Students in this program are selected based on academic achievements, superior conduct and Godly leadership qualities.

The National Beta Club

The National Beta Club at Anointed Word Christian Schools International is designed for students who are nominated based on scholastic achievements while maintaining a 3.0 grade point average, demonstrates leadership skills, character and citizenship.

National Honor Society

Per the [NHS National Constitution](#), all chapters' eligibility requirements must include, at minimum:

- attending school in grades 10 through 12
- maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 85 percent, B, 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale), or equivalent standard of excellence
- demonstrating volunteer or service hours
- preserving an excellent record of behavior in and out of school
- participating in leadership roles in school and/or community activities.

What are the benefits of a Christian School?

Is AWCSI accredited?

General School Policy
Affirmation of Core Beliefs Regarding Sexual Morality

Because of the school's belief that any sexual practices and lifestyles apart from that expressed in the marital union of 1 man and 1 woman are contrary to God's plan, and in fact, inimical and antithetical to the mandates and teachings of the Christian scriptures regarding personal living and conduct (Gen. 2:24, 19:5, 13; 26:8-9; Lev. 18:1-30; Rom. 1:26-29; 1 Cor. 5:1, 6-9; 1 Thess. 4:1-8; Heb. 13:4), the school will not admit students who themselves or their immediate families nor retain employees who engage or condone any form of homosexuality, lesbianism, bisexuality, incest, fornication, polygamy, or pornography. In addition, the school will not make the facilities, property, or staff members available to any persons or organizations that engage in, espouse, or encourage others in such practices.

Student/Family Policy

Policy on Cheating and Plagiarism

Plagiarism

Plagiarism demonstrates a lack of integrity and character that is inconsistent with the goals and values of Anointed Word Christian School International.

Developing good written expression consists of having well-formulated ideas are a fundamental skill is necessary in academic and career success. Plagiarism interferes with the assessment and feedback process that is necessary in order to promote academic growth. Plagiarism defrauds the teacher/instructor/facilitator with a false view of a student's strengths and weaknesses. It may prevent further instruction in areas of weakness and delay the student in reaching his or her potential.

Plagiarism includes

- taking someone else's assignment or portion of an assignment and submitting it as one's own
- submitting material written by someone else or rephrasing the ideas of another without giving the author's name or source
- presenting the work of tutors, parents, siblings, or friends as one's own
- submitting purchased papers as one's own
- submitting papers from the Internet written by someone else as one's own
- supporting plagiarism by providing work to others, whether it is believed it will be copied or not

Cheating

Cheating defined as the lacking of integrity and character that is inconsistent with the goals and values of Anointed Word Christian School International.

Education is based on learning specific skills, forming lifelong work habits, and developing mature coping skills according to each student's unique abilities. Stress propels students to make unethical choices. When students choose to cheat, it may be a symptom of more serious problems such as inappropriate class placement, over-commitment to extra-curricular activities, and/or academic desperation due to not having the ability to fully comprehend the information

taught in the courses. The compromise of their values through cheating may lead to loss of self-esteem, as the students are often painfully aware of their shortcomings and fight a tiring battle to preserve their images at the cost of their ethics. True self-esteem is based on competence. Cheating robs students of their opportunity to become competent. Assignments should be considered individual unless the instructor states otherwise.

Cheating includes:

- copying, faxing, emailing, or in any way duplicating assignments that are turned in, wholly or in part, as original work
- exchanging assignments with other students, either handwritten or computer generated, whether it is believed they will be copied or not
- using any form of memory aid during tests or quizzes without the expressed permission of the instructor.
- using a computer or other means to translate an assignment from one language into another language and submitting it as an original translation
- giving or receiving answers during tests or quizzes. It is the student's responsibility to secure his or her papers so other students will not have the opportunity or the temptation to copy
- taking credit for group work when the student has not contributed an equal or appropriate share toward the final result
- accessing a test or quiz for the purpose of determining the questions in advance of its administration.
- using summaries/commentaries (*Cliffs Notes*, *Spark Notes*, etc.) in lieu of reading the assigned materials.

The following behaviors promote true student achievement:

1. Be prepared. Try to keep to a realistic schedule balancing academic obligations and one's social and personal life.
2. Make certain that you understand your assignments and the grading assessment that will be used. If you have questions about an assignment or an assessment, talk to your instructor. Do not rely solely upon a classmate for clarification.
3. If you study for a test with a classmate, make sure that you do not sit near each other during the test since your responses (and errors) may be similar.
4. Do not read or scan someone else's paper before writing your own. Some

of the ideas in the other person's paper may be ideas that you would have used, but you will now need to credit the person whose paper you read for those ideas.

5. Use all avenues of support available to you. For help needed beyond the classroom, see your teacher, a peer tutor, or a parent or other adult who is knowledgeable of the subject area in question.
6. Assignments should be considered individual unless the instructor states otherwise.
7. Be organized. Having class notes in an orderly, easily accessible format will save time and anxiety when studying for a test or writing a paper.
8. Keep current with assignments. If you need to read an entire novel the evening before a test or before a paper is due on that novel, your performance on either will suffer.
9. If, for whatever reason, you choose to use another's ideas or solutions, cite that person as a source on your paper or project.
10. Know what constitutes cheating, including all the variations of plagiarism.
